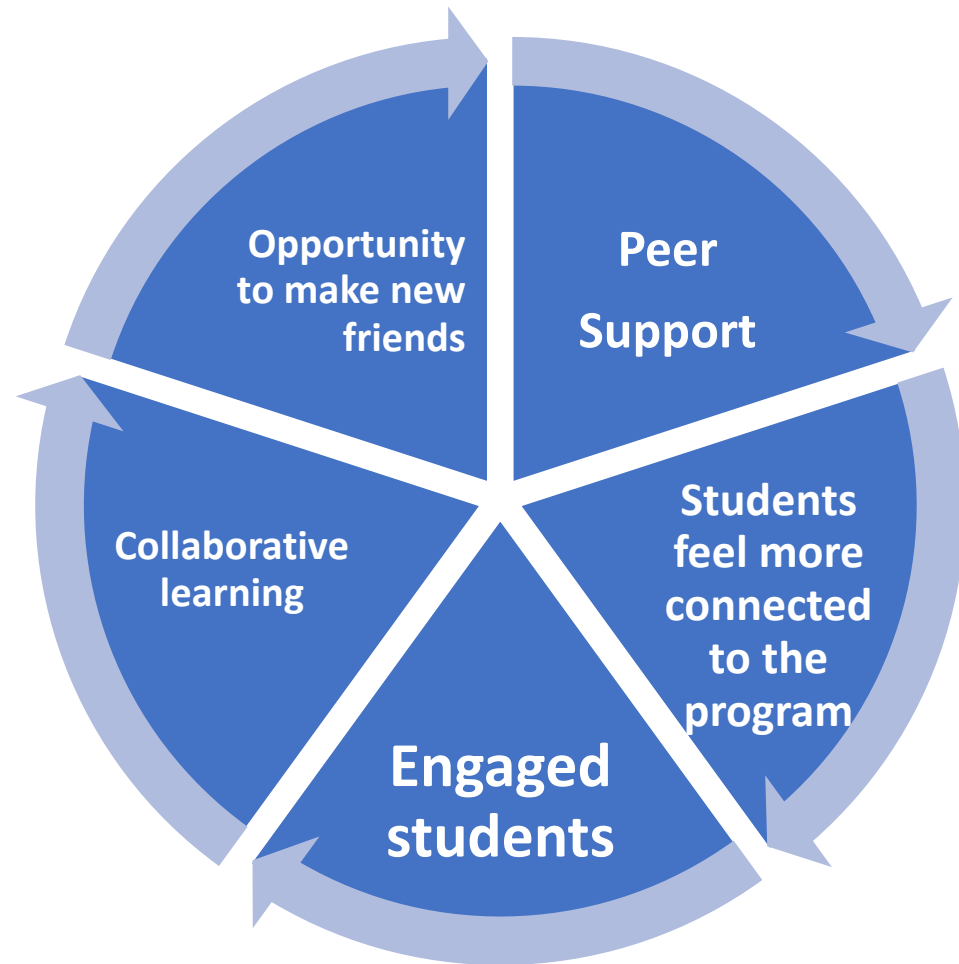

Honours Social Science Profiles

Advantages

- Honours students take their core classes together and form a learning community of motivated peers
- Honours students attend **weekly meetings** to learn from guest speakers from a wide variety of fields and participate in a community service project
 - ✓ Enriched learning experience
- Honours courses are **assessed at the same level** as regular Social Science courses and are compared to ALL regular Social Science courses.
 - ✓ No need to worry about having a lower average or R-score

Honours Social Science Profiles

Application Process

- 40 students selected each year
 - All students with >85% average are encouraged to apply!
 - Apply to the regular Social Science program via SRAM
- AND**
- Apply directly to the Honours program via JAC's web site
 - Letter of intent
 - Academic letter of reference
